## What is National Road Safety Week?


NRSW is an annual initiative from the Safer Australian Roads and Highways (SARAH) Group, partnering road safety organisations and Government.

The week highlights the impact of road trauma and how we can reduce it.



### 5 most common causes of road accidents<sup>3</sup>

- Speeding
- Distracted driving (including using mobile phones)
- **Impaired driving** (under the influence of drugs and alcohol)
- Fatigue
- Vehicle defects (e.g. faulty brakes, bald tires, alignment problems)







## Did you know?

Taking your eyes off the road for just 2 seconds increases your risk of crashing by **2X** 

Here are a few simple things every driver can do to make our roads safer.

### 3 ways you can make Australian roads safer



See "first responders" and emergency service personnel on the side of the road and a vehicle with hazard or emergency lights?

Slow down to 40km/hr.

Driving with another car immediately in front of you?

Maintain a gap of 3 seconds or more so you have enough time to react and brake.





Vehicle showing signs of wear and tear?

Check it's fit-for-purpose and meets safety standards.
